



The Person County Education Foundation is dedicated to serving students in grades K-12 in traditional and charter public schools of Person County, North Carolina. PCEF is a non-profit, tax-exempt organization under Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(3) and has been granted public charity status.

PCEF administers scholarships and awards annually for graduates of Person County. Each scholarship has a specific purpose and tailored eligibility criteria. These scholarships are managed by PCEF's Scholarship Committee, with the involvement of high school counselors, teachers, and scholarship donors. Individuals and groups may set up a scholarship for many reasons including honoring the life of a person, honoring their graduating class, or helping a deserving student to succeed.

Thank you for your interest in creating a scholarship at PCEF. This packet contains information and samples to help the process of establishing a scholarship. After reviewing these materials, please feel free to contact us with any additional questions or concerns that you may have.

Scholarships may be funded through an investment account (which builds over time and draws interest) or through annual contributions to fund the scholarship each year. Based on your wishes, we will assist in the composition of a new fund agreement letter so that we can administer the fund in accordance with your intentions as the years go by. The Person County Educational Foundation is happy to facilitate gifts of stock, real and/or personal property, IRAs and/or other retirement accounts, life insurance, and more.

Our scholarship donors are corporations, associations, organizations, foundations and individuals who want to create a brighter future by encouraging education. Each donor has the opportunity to determine the criteria of their scholarship. The Foundation provides professional assistance in establishing the scholarship funds, including advertising and promotion, clerical support, and an awards reception in April. The reception gives the donors and scholarship recipients the opportunity to meet if they haven't already done so.

You can get the help you need to quickly set up a Scholarship Fund. Our Director and Scholarship Committee works tirelessly to be sure information is distributed to guidance counselors and potential applicants; applications are processed promptly and contain complete information; checks are written, and gifts are acknowledged promptly when the fund receives donations.

Establishing a Scholarship FAQ'S

How soon can I get started?

We can set up your scholarship fund as soon as you have established your criteria, sign a scholarship agreement and provide the funds. After the first year, all Annual Scholarships must be paid before April 1st.

What are the advantages of establishing a scholarship with PCEF?

Donors/businesses come to us because they want to give back, but there's usually something more. Scholarships are very personal. Many of our scholarships are established to honor someone, maybe a family member or a company founder. Some people establish a scholarship in their own name in their will. For some people, it's important that their name lives on in philanthropy after they are gone. We call that planned giving and those future gifts can be arranged today. Your gift can be based on something that matters to you. Maybe you love art. Maybe your career in engineering is something you want to pass on. Our students send the donors thank you letters and it can be very rewarding to see the difference the scholarship made in the student's life.

What is the difference between an endowed scholarship and an annual scholarship?

Endowed Scholarships create a permanent fund. Contributions are prudently invested to ensure the scholarship retains its value in perpetuity, and the scholarships created by the endowment are funded through the income generated by the endowment. Chad Horner, Horner's Financial Services, handles all PCEF's endowment scholarships. If you are interested in an endowed scholarship, it is recommended that we meet together to discuss your options and answer any questions. The chart below indicates the scholarship amount your investment generates.

Annual Scholarships reflect a donor's commitment to support a scholarship for a specific number of years.



How does the scholarship process work?

Our Executive Director distributes information regarding PCEF scholarships to Person County schools and guidance departments. Scholarships are advertised in local newspapers, on social media, as well as on the PCEF website. The Director also visits each High School during the application process to meet with students who may have questions or need help with the application.

PCEF uses an online application system. This streamlines the process making it easier for students to apply and committee members to review applications. The PCEF Executive Director screens the online applications to ensure that students meet specific criteria and that they include all necessary attachments. Students only have to complete one application to apply for all PCEF scholarship's that they qualify for!

The scoring process is monitored by the Executive Director who creates comparison charts that include financial and academic measurement for the PCEF Scholarship Committee to review, along with all eligible applications. The committee gathers in person multiple times to review and discuss the applications. The committee also vote on the selection of applicants to interview. After the committee conducts interviews, the committee will again meet in person to discuss and vote on the selection of the scholarship recipient.

What is the renewal process?

Scholarship renewals are managed by the PCEF Executive Director who keeps in contact with college students and reminds them of renewal opportunities or obligations. Each May, students are emailed a renewal link to complete. Each renewal is reviewed by the PCEF Scholarship Committee and voted on for approval. Renewal Essays are sent to donors.

Can I choose the recipient of the scholarship?

Our Scholarship Director will guide you through a process that allows donors to participate with the PCEF Scholarship Committee in the screening and interviewing of applicants to the extent allowed by federal law. Unfortunately, it is not possible for donors to pre-select or individually choose recipients.

If you'd rather not participate in the process, you still have the opportunity to meet the scholarship recipient at PCEF's scholarship donor reception held in April. For donors who would like to meet scholarship recipients in a separate setting, PCEF will coordinate a time that works with the donor and student. This is a great way for the donor to get to know the student and to share information about the reason the fund was established. If donors wish to remain anonymous, we are mindful of those donors and their decision. If you wish to remain anonymous, be assured that confidentiality is of the utmost importance at the PCEF.



What is your scholarship payment process?

Our policy is to pay the college, university or trade school directly. Each student submit a scholarship disbursement form, proof of enrollment, and any other documents as required by the scholarship fund agreement for payment to be approved. Examples of documentation include: a copy of that semester's tuition bill, class schedule, and student ID numbers.


PCEF also requires all students to write a thank you letter to the donor. All thank you notes are sent directly to PCEF, copied for their file, and then sent directly to the donor.

What can Scholarship Dollars Pay For?

Per IRS Publication 970:

Qualified education expenses: For purposes of tax-free scholarships and fellowship grants, these are expenses for: Tuition and fees required to enroll at or attend an eligible educational institution; and Course-related expenses, such as fees, books, supplies, and equipment that are required for the courses at the eligible educational institution. These items must be required of all students in your course of instruction.

Expenses that don't qualify. Qualified education expenses don't include the cost of: Room and board, Travel, Research, Clerical help, or Equipment and other expenses that aren't required for enrollment in or attendance at an eligible educational institution.

PCEF SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

The Victoria Jalissa Bradsher Daniel

The Victoria Jalissa Bradsher Daniel Memorial Scholarship, established in 2018 by her co-workers at Orange County Child Support Services, honors Victoria's memory and celebrates her commitment to youth, her community, and her alma-mater, Elizabeth City State University. This \$500 scholarship is available to Person High School graduating seniors planning to attend Elizabeth City State University, North Carolina Central University, or North Carolina A & T. Applicants will complete an application and interview process where good moral character, academics, financial need, community service, and leadership, are considerations.

The Reverend L.G. and Rosa Harris Elliott Scholarship Fund

To honor the memory of Reverend L.G. Elliott and Rosa Harris Elliott who believed in the importance education; and to honor Bobby Harris who served on the boards of several educational organizations, including a 14-year term on the Person County School Board, The Harris Family has established the **Reverend L.G. and Rosa Harris Elliott Scholarship Fund**. This \$1,000 scholarship is available to Person High School graduating seniors planning to attend a community college, private college, or university and interested in considering teaching, and other avenues within the field of education. Applicants will complete an application and interview process where community service, leadership, and financial need are considerations.



The Dave and Ann Hodge Access Scholarship

To honor the memory of his Helena High School Coach Dave Hodge, and honoring his wife Ann Hodge, Carl Rogers has established **The Dave and Ann Hodge Access Scholarship**. This scholarship is available to Person County seniors graduating from PHS and RCS who plan to attend East Carolina University. Financial need, academic standing, and community service are primary considerations for the application and interview process. The Hodge Scholarship provides recipients with a \$5,000 award for the first year of study. The scholarship may be renewable for three additional years if certain conditions are met.



The W. O. Humphries Family Scholarship Description

The W. O. Humphries Family Scholarship was established in the early 1990s to assist students who desire to attend a four-year college or university. The scholarship is awarded based on evidence of academic achievement, financial need, extracurricular activities, and letters of recommendation.

The Dr. Thomas D. and Lelia C. Long Scholarship

The Dr. Thomas D. and Lelia C. Long Scholarship is available to Person County seniors graduating from Person High School and Roxboro Community School who plan to attend a community college, private college, or university. Academic excellence as well as financial need are primary considerations for the competitive application and interview process. The Long Scholarship provides recipients with a \$1,000 award for the first year of study. The scholarship may be renewable for three additional years if certain conditions are met.




Sandy Moore Scholarship Description

To honor the memory of Sanford “Sandy” Barcliff Moore II, Allen Martin established the **Sandy Moore Scholarship**. Moore, a 1982 PHS graduate who passed away in 2015, exemplified a disciplined work ethic at an early age which carried over into his career. The \$500 award was established to encourage a PHS graduating senior who lives in a single-parent household, exhibits first-generation college student status, demonstrates financial need, and displays a high degree of perseverance.

Sarah Elizabeth Morton “Teach In Person” Scholarship Description

In 2012, Rena Morton established the **Sarah Elizabeth Morton “Teach In Person” Scholarship** in memory of her daughter. A 1999 graduate of PHS, Sarah received her bachelor’s degree from UNC Wilmington in 2003 and six years later received her National Board Certification as well as her master’s degree from East Carolina University. She taught eighth grade social studies at Southern Middle School for six years and advised the student council and yearbook staffs. In May 2010, Sarah lost her battle to ovarian cancer. The endowment, along with monies donated by Person County Schools’ employees, offers a \$1,000 scholarship to graduating PHS seniors majoring in education. Applicants are evaluated based on academic standing, character, leadership among peers, service in the community, and preparation for a career in educating students in the public schools of Person County.

In 2018, a **Sarah Elizabeth Morton “Teach in Person” Beginning Teacher Award** was established to assist college graduates returning to Person County Schools to teach. Applicants are evaluated based on college involvement, character, leadership among peers, service in the community, and additional volunteering within the Person County Schools. Rena’s wish is to find great teachers, like Sarah, who are passionate about serving others and their community.



The Merle S. Solomon and Jean H. Solomon Scholarship Fund Description


The Merle S. and Jean H. Solomon Scholarship is available to Person County seniors graduating from PHS and RCS who plan to attend a technical program of study at a community college, a recognized trade school, or a two- or four-year institution of higher learning. Established in 1995, this scholarship encourages Person County students who have shown a high degree of ability and interest in a technical field to continue their education after high school. The Solomon's established this endowment to "help people who work with their hands." The Solomon Scholarship provides recipients with an award up to a maximum of \$1,500 per year of study. The scholarship may be renewable for an additional year if certain conditions are met.

The Person County Education Anonymous Donors Scholarship

The Person County Education Anonymous Donors Scholarship was established by anonymous donors to be awarded to students of high potential for success in their careers. Those eligible must be Person County Residents attending Person High School, Roxboro Community School, or a North Carolina Free Public Residential School who plan to attend a community college, private college, or university. Aptitude and creativity, volunteerism, extracurricular activities, and leadership skills for becoming an effective contributor in his or her field of study and to society are primary considerations for the competitive application and interview process. The Anonymous Donors Scholarship is funded through PCEF's Anonymous Scholarship Program and award amounts vary.

The Person County Education Spirit Scholarship

The Person County Education Spirit Scholarship is available to Person County seniors graduating from Person High School and Roxboro Community School who plan to attend a community college, private college, or university. The recipient of the PCEF Spirit Award is given to the student who, through application and interview, exhibited high moral character, integrity, a heart for helping others, and a determination to make contributions to his community and others in the future. Leadership, excellence and achievement, citizenship, community spirit, honesty, integrity, and self-discipline are determining factors when selecting recipient. The Spirit Scholarship is funded through PCEF's Anonymous Scholarship Program and provides recipients with a \$500 award for the first year of study.



The following sample is a Donor Advised Fund Renewable Scholarship

Dave and Ann Hodge Access Scholarship Agreement and Criteria

The Person County Education Foundation supports the students and employees of Person County Schools governed by the Person County Board of Education, Roxboro Community School governed by the Roxboro Community School Board of Directors, and Bethel Hill Charter School governed by the Bethel Hill Charter School Board of Directors.

Purpose: Established in 2018 by Carl Rogers (Helena High 1965) to honor the memory of Dave Hodge, a Helena High School Coach, and in honor of his wife, Ann Hodge

Award: One (1) graduate from Person High School or Roxboro Community School will receive \$5,000 per year toward post-secondary education at East Carolina University. This scholarship is renewable for a total of four (4) years [eight (8) semesters] of college. This scholarship will be given to a minimum of 10 students over a 10-year period.

Criteria: This scholarship was established to encourage a Person County resident to pursue furthering his/her post-secondary education at East Carolina University. This student should ideally exhibit:

1. Financial need
2. Good academic standing
3. Record of Community Service
4. Leadership skills
5. Strength of Character

Considerations:

1. First-generation college status
2. Single Parent Household

Renewal Criteria: This scholarship is renewable for 4 years (8 semesters) if the following criteria is met:

1. First semester GPA minimum of 2.75
2. GPA minimum of 2.9 (after first semester)
3. Completion of PCEF Renewal Application

Procedure: The PCEF Executive Director will make the scholarship application accessible to all PHS and RCS graduating seniors with the assistance of the schools' Guidance Departments. In accordance with the established Foundation guidelines, all candidates shall submit a completed PCEF Scholarship Application Form together with a resume, his/her high school transcript, and two (2) letters of recommendation.

Selection: The PCEF Scholarship Committee will meet to interview qualified applicants, if deemed necessary, and select the award recipient. The donor or his/her designee may participate in the interview process if he/she or designee so desires.

Awarding of Scholarship: At the school's Senior Awards Night program, a PCEF representative along with the donor or his/her designee (if so desired) will present the award to the recipient. An annual press release featuring the award winner will be in the local newspaper.

Agreements between Parties

- A) Agreement shall be in effect beginning the 2018-2019 school year.
- B) Amount of Scholarship: \$5,000.00 will be given to a minimum of 10 students over a 10-year period. Each scholarship is renewable for a total of four (4) years [eight (8) semesters] of college.
- C) PCEF will receive funding prior to April 1st each year.
- D) The scholarship is to be paid to East Carolina University on behalf of the scholarship recipient each year between June 1 and September 1.
- E) PCEF will contact donor of renewal status yearly. In the event a designated recipient fails to meet the renewal criteria determined by the Foundation board, the scholarship will not be issued that semester, however may be reissued the following semester(s).
- F) In the event a designated recipient fails to enroll in the East Carolina University as indicated in his or her application following graduation from high school, the scholarship shall be deemed to have been forfeited and upon approval of the Foundation board and Donor, an alternate recipient will be named. If the student changes colleges the scholarship will not follow and with the approval of the Foundation board and Donor, an alternate recipient will be named.
- G) In the event of the donor’s death, a member of the donor’s family will continue to have input of the disbursement of funds for the entire life of the Scholarship if they so desire.
- H) Each scholarship recipient will join the Access Scholarship Program at East Carolina University and meet all Access Scholarship Program requirements and criteria, with the exception of minimum GPA requirement of 3.0.

The following sample is a renewable, endowment scholarship

Dr. Thomas D. and Lelia C. Long Scholarship Agreement and Criteria

The Person County Education Foundation supports the students and employees of Person County Schools governed by the Person County Board of Education, Roxboro Community School governed by the Roxboro Community School Board of Directors, and Bethel Hill Charter School governed by the Bethel Hill Charter School Board of Directors.

Purpose: To honor Dr. Thomas Drumwright Long, Sr. and his wife, Lelia Carver Long

Award: One (1) graduate from Person High School or Roxboro Community School will receive \$1,000 toward a year of post-secondary education. This amount may fluctuate based on the success of the endowment fund. This scholarship is renewable for a total of four (4) years [eight (8) semesters] of college.

Criteria: This scholarship is established to encourage a Person County resident to pursue furthering his/her post-secondary education at a community college, private college, or public university. This student should exhibit academic excellence, volunteerism, leadership, and some financial need. Renewals will be dependent on PCEF Scholarship Committee's review of student's most recent college transcript and application for renewal.

Procedure: The PCEF Executive Director will make the scholarship application accessible to all PHS and RCS graduating seniors with the assistance of the schools' Guidance Departments. In accordance with the established Foundation guidelines, all candidates shall submit a completed PCEF Scholarship Application Form together with a resume, his/her high school transcript, and two (2) letters of recommendation.

Selection: The PCEF Scholarship Committee will meet to interview qualified applicants, if deemed necessary, and select the award recipient. The donor or his/her designee may participate in the interview process if he/she or designee so desires.

Awarding of Scholarship: At the school's Senior Awards Night program, a PCEF representative along with the donor or his/her designee, if so desired, will present the award to the recipient. An annual press release featuring the award winner will be in the local newspaper.

Agreements between Parties

- A) Agreement shall be in effect beginning the 2016-2017 school year.
- B) Amount of Endowment: \$XXXX
- C) One percent (1%) of principal will be used for administrative fees on a yearly basis.
- D) The award is to be paid to the post-secondary institution on behalf of the scholarship recipient each year between June 1 and September 1.



Sanford “Sandy” Barcliff Moore II Award Agreement between Allen Martin and PCEF

The Person County Education Foundation supports the students and employees of Person County Schools governed by the Person County Board of Education, Roxboro Community School governed by the Roxboro Community School Board of Directors, and Bethel Hill Charter School governed by the Bethel Hill Charter School Board of Directors.

Purpose: To honor the memory of Sanford “Sandy” Barcliff Moore II, a 1982 Person High School graduate who was a member of the United States Army and, with hard work, overcame obstacles to further his education. Sandy exemplified a disciplined work ethic at an early age that carried over into his career. He was a dedicated employee at Coca-Cola Bottling Company in Charlotte, North Carolina from 1988 until 2015.

Award: One (1) graduate from Person High School will receive \$1,000. \$500 to be donated by Mr. Allen Martin and \$500 to be donated by Mr. Martin’s employer’s matching funds program. PCEF will invoice Mr. Martin on a yearly basis.


Criteria: The award is established to encourage a Person High School graduating senior who

- 1) live in a single-parent household,
- 2) plan to attend college after graduation,
- 3) exhibit first-generation college student status,
- 4) demonstrate financial need, and
- 5) display a high degree of perseverance.

Procedure: The PHS Guidance Department will determine award candidates and send its nominations to the PCEF Scholarship Committee.

Selection: The PCEF Scholarship Committee will meet to select the award recipient.

Awarding of Scholarship: At the Person High School annual awards program, a PCEF representative will present the award to the recipient. An annual press release featuring the award winner will be in the local newspaper. The recipient will receive a short biography about Sandy Moore describing the impact he had on others while living.
